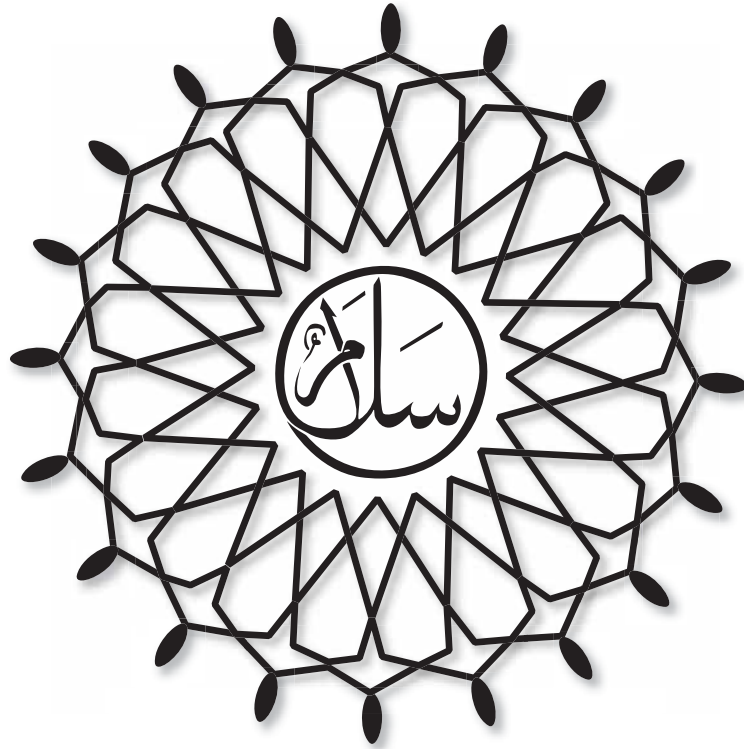

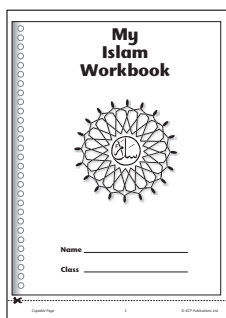

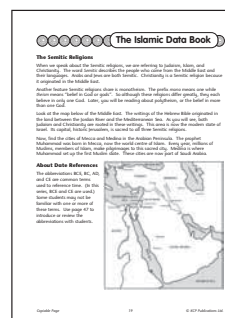

These can be re-used from class to class.

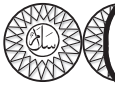
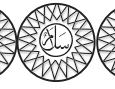
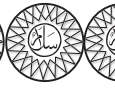
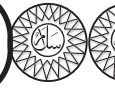


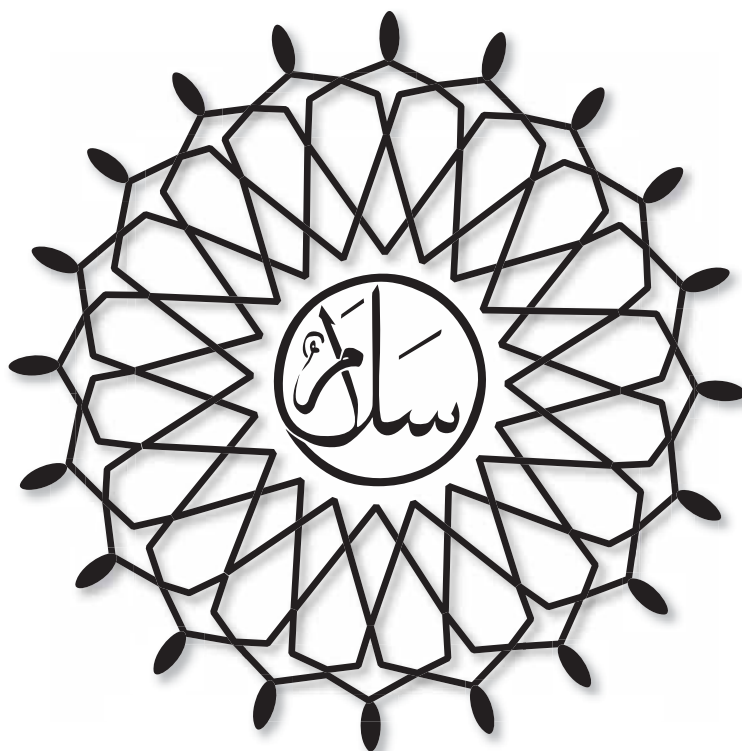
